Name of Site, Name of institution/organization affiliated with the site (sponsor or publisher), date of resource creation, hyperlinked URL. ## **In-Text Citations**

To cite quotes and paraphrase in text, use these formats:

Basic Format: (Author page number).

• **Example**: Romantic poetry is characterized by the "spontaneous overflow of powerful feelings" (Wordsworth 263).

#### Two Authors

• **Example:** It has been suggested that "meditation is an often overlooked but powerful option for dispute resolution in health care" (Tompkins and Benson 36).

#### Three or More Authors

• **Example:** There are many theories about the Bermuda Triangle, "a magnetic irregularity that interferes with compasses, a plot by the government or some foreign power, a spatiotemporal hole, extraterrestrial activity, the influence of the mythical lost civilization of Atlantis..." (Le Carrer et al. 152).

#### Author Stated in Sentence

- **Example:** Wordsworth stated that Romantic poetry was marked by a "spontaneous overflow of powerful feelings" (263).
- **Example:** Wordsworth extensively explored the role of emotion in the creative process (263).

#### No Known Author

- Use the title instead.
- **Example:** We see so many global warming hotspots in North America likely because this region has "more readily accessible climatic data and more comprehensive programs to monitor and study environmental change . . ." ("Impact of Global Warming" 6).

#### No Page Number

Just don't include it.

# Formatting Authors, Titles, and Dates in Work Cited

# Citing Authors in MLA Works Cited

One Author: Last Name, First Name.

• **Example:** Schlosser, Eric.

Two Authors: Last Name, First Name and First Name Last Name

• Example: Portes, Alejandro, and Rubén Rumbaut.

Three or More Authors: Last Name, First Name and et al.

• Example: Nevadomski-Berdan, Stacie, et al.

Et al. is the abbreviated Latin phrase "et alia." It means "and others"

No Author: Use the title of the resource instead.

• **Example:** "Humor." *International Encyclopedia of Social Sciences,* edited by David L. Sills, vol. 7, Macmillan, 1968, pp. 1-8.

### Formatting Titles in MLA Works Cited

Titles are capitalized.

If a work is stand alone, like a book or a whole website, then the title is italicized.

• **Example:** Schlosser, Eric. *Fast Food Nation: The Dark Side of the All-American Meal*. Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, 2012.

If a work is part of a larger whole (like a short story in a textbook, article on a website, or academic article in a journal) then the title is in quotation marks.

• **Example:** McPhate, Mike. "California Today: A Leaning Tower in San Francisco." New York Times, 14 Sept. 2016, <a href="https://www.nytimes.com/2016/09/14/us/california-today-sinking-millennium-tower.html">www.nytimes.com/2016/09/14/us/california-today-sinking-millennium-tower.html</a>.

# Formatting Dates in MLA Works Cited

Dates should be formatted as day month year. The month should be abbreviated.

• **Example:** 5 Nov. 2018.

If you do not have a day or month just include the year. If you do not have a date of publication/creation don't include it as part of the citation.
